He is called Visva-kavi (World-Poet) and is indeed among the world's greatest men. Even today they impress readers with their astuteness of observation, depth of understanding, warmth of feelings and beauty of expression. Each story has a relevance that transcends time and space. A few have a subtle humour, a few are chilling. They display a wide variety of themes and characters, a deep love of nature and a philosophy of rising above material possessions. Tagore valued freedom of thought and several of his stories show how crushing traditional schooling can be. He also urged the need for educating the girl-child and giving her a good chance in life. While he wrote against the persistence of superstitions, he also believed in the supernatural, sometimes even using the planchet to call up spirits of the many who had departed from his life.
